2012 Table Tennis U.S. Olympic Trials Individual Tickets On Sale January 1

Cary, N.C – Individual session tickets for the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials – Table Tennis, to be held in Bond Park Community Center in Cary, NC from February 9-12, 2012, will go on sale Sunday, January 1, at 10:00 a.m. Individual tickets cost \$5 on February 9th, and \$10 each day February 10th-12th.

To date, tickets for the 2012 US Olympic Trials – Table Tennis have only been available through a U.S. Trials package and a Friends of Table Tennis package that also includes the North America 2012 Olympic Games Qualifying Tournament in April. This Friends of Table Tennis Ticket Package, which includes admission to the Athlete VIP Party, and tickets to all sessions of both the U.S. and North America 2012 Olympic Games Qualifying Tournament, is also on sale along with the U.S. Trials package.

The top placewinners from the U.S. Trials will go on to compete in the North American Olympic Trials to be held in Cary April 20-22, 2012. The top two women and top three men from this event will qualify to represent their country at the 2012 Summer Olympic Games in London.

About the Table Tennis Olympic Trials

The 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials – Table Tennis is an event of the US Olympic Committee to be held from Thursday, February 8 through Sunday, February 12, 2012 at Bond Park Community Center in Cary, NC. The U.S. Trials will feature the top 40 players in the US vying for a spot on the 2012 US Olympic Team. The U.S. Trials open on Thursday, February 8, where any registered participant (including registered members of the public) can compete for a spot on the U.S. Team.

The North America 2012 Olympic Games Qualifying Tournament is an event of North America Table Tennis taking place from Friday, April 20 through Sunday, April 22, 2012 also at Bond Park Community Center in Cary, NC. The North America Trials feature the top 25 players in the hemisphere competing for the final spots in the London 2012 Olympic Games.

The two trials competitions comprise the first-ever Olympic Trials events in Cary, NC.

About Cary 2012

Cary 2012 is the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) for both the 2012 US Olympic Trials – Table Tennis and the North America 2012 Olympic Games Qualifying Tournament. Cary 2012 is a collaborative effort among the Triangle Sports Commission, Greater Raleigh Convention & Visitors Bureau, Town of Cary, and the Cary Table Tennis Association, in cooperation with USA Table Tennis and the United States Olympic Committee.
